CRC celebrates Recovery Month, has high hopes for parity, ACA

October 7, 2013

Having insurance coverage for treatment for substance use disorders (SUDs) is critical for patients, but it only works if treatment providers accept insurance. CRC Health Group is unusual in listing the insurance companies it contracts with on its website, and officials of the Cupertino, California-based national treatment chain talked to ADAW last month about the role of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in increasing census rates thanks to improved insurance coverage.

Andy Eckert, CEO of CRC, said the chain’s 140 programs, including the more than 40 that are residential, are geared toward commercially insured patients with a focus on the young adult population. This is the group that under the ACA can be insured under their parents’ plans. “That’s giving a tremendous uplift” to the ability to provide treatment to this age group, said Eckert.

“We’re investing heavily in this,” said Eckert. “This year alone we’re adding more than 200 beds, particularly in our programs that are geared toward commercial insurance.” When the ACA is fully implemented in January, an even larger segment of the population will be covered, he said.

Insurance battles

But insurance companies do not always want to pay what treatment costs. “To some extent, the insurance business is always in tension with the medical requirement to provide treatment the right way,” said Barry McCaffrey, CRC board member, and a retired U.S. general and former director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy. He noted that at Life Healing Center, CRC headquarters for National Recovery Month, the staff-patient ratio is one-to-one. This is important “if you’re going to provide clinically, scientifically based, outcome-based therapy, and deal with people who have serious trauma issues, compounded by drug and alcohol abuse, and if you’re going to ensure their safety,” McCaffrey told ADAW. “We also want a workplace where our professionals get an adequate salary and have healthcare themselves.”

CRC has been very active in Washington about what levels of care will be included under the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act — the parity law, said Eckert. There is still no final rule. “We’re advocating that residential treatment be included in the benefits package,” he said. “At the same time, we are aggressively trying to respond to today’s marketplace.” “Let me

add a caution,” said McCaffrey. “One program that is universally powerful is art therapy, and that doesn’t sound like a medical procedure.” And it’s an example of the kind of program that is not likely to be funded by insurance. “We know we can get people into sobriety, detox them safely and do relapse prevention — but a lot of it is an art,” he said. “The ACA needs to take that into account.”

Partial hospitalization

Many programs are paid by insurance at the partial hospitalization but are actually residential. CRC is working with an insurance company on an innovative program for opioid addiction in rural California, setting up partial hospitalization programs where the provider is already active. The program runs five hours a day, five days a week, and is designed and customized for this payer. “We’re hoping this will be a creative way that we are addressing a need,” said Eckert. “The reality is that we have to continue to find out how to meet folks where they are.” In other words, the treatment has to be affordable.

National Recovery Month Comments 9/20

Barak Wolff, Former Director, New Mexico Public Health Division and Policy Analyst, Senate Public Affairs Committee

- It is an honor to be here on behalf of Senator Jerry Ortiz y Pino, Chair of the NM Senate Public Affairs Committee and Vice-Chair of the LHHS Interim Committee. Senator Ortiz y Pino has a previously scheduled meeting in Albuquerque this morning, but very much wanted to be represented here today.

- Senator Ortiz y Pino, a retired social worker who spent years working with communities to ensure comprehensive health and social services, has been a champion for behavioral health in NM for many years, including addiction and recovery services. When I pressed him for a few comments I could share today, Jerry wrote:

"In New Mexico we have a huge opioid overdose death problem; we have a huge alcohol abuse and DWI problem that we've tried for years to address effectively, but still continues; and, we have a huge heroin addiction problem that is multi-generational and destroys far too many of our families. So, we need to generate a sense of urgency in our state over the need to ramp up our treatment efforts."

- In addition Senator Ortiz y Pino, who is in the middle of our current behavioral health crisis in NM, added that the current challenges to our behavioral health system and the switchover to Centennial Care, our new Medicaid program in NM, create additional concerns and anxiety regarding the future of these critical services. He wanted to assure all that the Legislature is following these developments very closely and will certainly be taking action in the upcoming session.

- In my remaining minute I'd like to go back to my public health roots and acknowledge that addiction and recovery are major public health challenges here in NM and across the country. As such it must be addressed on a population wide basis including primary prevention to stop it before it starts, secondary prevention to recognize the problem when it occurs and minimize the damage, and tertiary prevention where treatment and recovery services are made available to all those in need. It is only with this kind of comprehensive approach that we can hope to turn the tide of this devastating disease.

(Santa Fe, NM) – The Santa Fe, NM Life Healing Center (25 Vista Point Road, Santa Fe, NM 87508), will host this year's National Recovery Month Headquarters News Conference at 11AM Friday, September 20, that will celebrate alcohol and drug abuse treatment and report that nationwide 24 million now lack treatment, including 225,000 in New Mexico, according to the federal Department of Health and Human Services. The event, leading 100 events nationwide the same day, will note recent trends including a quintupling of prescription opiate addictions according to the Centers for Disease Control, and will cite the importance of trauma recovery, a specialty of Life Healing Center.

Attending and speaking at the news conference will be: **Four-Star General Barry McCaffrey** (Ret), former U.S. National Drug Policy Director ("Drug Czar") and Commander, SouthCom (all U.S. forces in Latin America) and Gulf War Division Commander; **Robert Garcia, Sheriff, Santa Fe County**; **Alexis Duprey, reigning Miss New Mexico 2013**, with a platform of strong families against substance abuse, coming to the event immediately following her Miss America pageant the week before and reporting on it; **Jennifer Padgett, Deputy Secretary, New Mexico Department of Children, Youth, and Families**; **Barak Wolff, former Director, New Mexico Public Health Division**, and current policy analyst, New Mexico Senate Public Affairs Committee, under Senator and Chairman Jerry Oritz y Pino; **Andrew Black**, field representative, U.S. Senator Martin Heinrich; **Jennifer Manazaneres**, field representative and tribal-substance abuse liaison, U.S. Congressman Ben Ray Lujan; and **Steve Brugge**, recovery advocate, who will discuss personal recovery experiences. This is an important event to help generate community awareness about addiction treatment and celebrate all of those who are succeeding in recovery."

Eckert explained, "In partnership with the HHS/SAMHSA National Recovery Month, CRC Health Group, the country's largest substance abuse treatment provider, has selected Santa Fe's Life Healing Center as the national headquarters for the "Pathways to Recovery" event and will be leading the celebration for over 100 locations nationwide. Life Healing Center has been selected as the headquarter event because it is a national model in treatment that addresses both trauma and addiction and has been helping people heal since 1993, and because of its location in New Mexico's Capital City, Santa Fe."

McCaffrey added, "The news conference kicks off a larger national event to celebrate National Recovery Month sponsored by SAMHSA, within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This year's Recovery Month theme, 'Join the Voices for Recovery: A Path to Recovery' emphasizes that while the road to recovery may be varied, the benefits are significant and valuable to individuals, families, and communities. According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the national 'treatment gap' of those who 'need but do not receive treatment' is 24 million individuals, including 225,000 in New Mexico."
